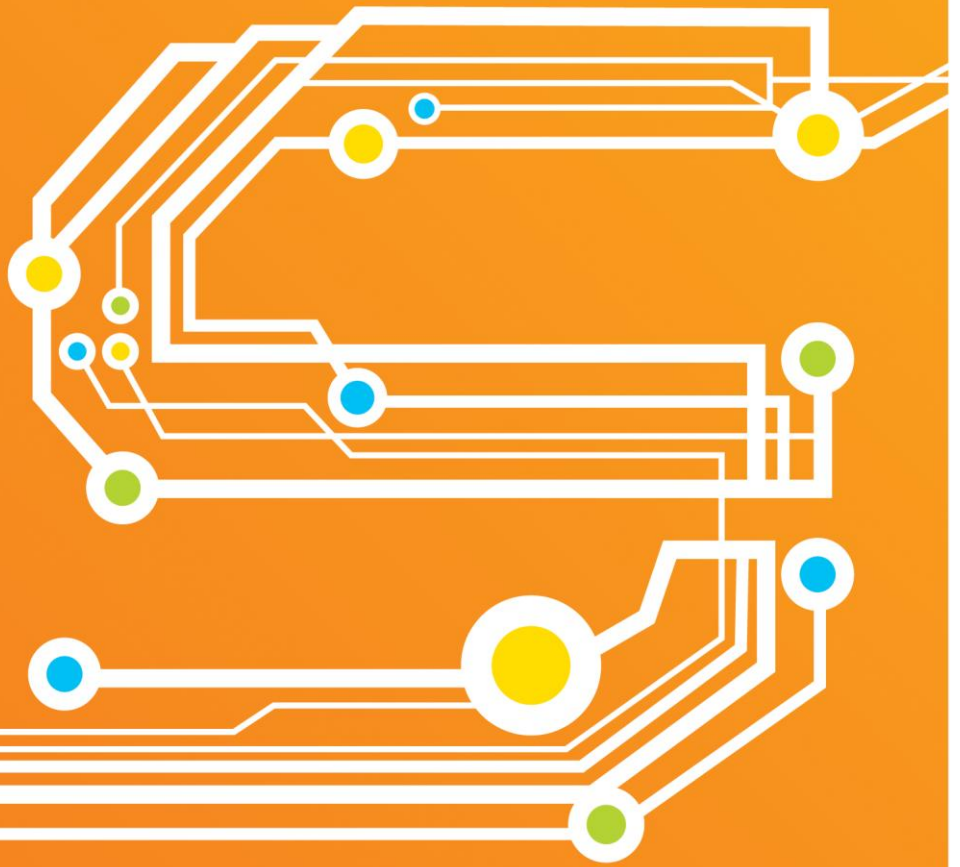

We have established and will continue to review, update, maintain and implement documented environmental objectives and targets at each relevant level of our activities.

Saftronics will carry out periodic self-assessments to determine our position in relation to this policy statement. In line with our commitment to continual improvement, there will be periodic evaluation of environmental performance across the range of our activities.

When establishing and reviewing our objectives, we shall consider the legal and other requirements, our significant environmental aspects, our technological options and our financial, operational and business requirements, as well as the views of interested parties.

At Saftronics our environmental activities include:

- Regular reviews of our policy statement to monitor our progress
- Regular evaluations of our environmental performance in all areas of our business
- Ensuring we meet, and where possible exceed, all legal and other requirements relating to environmental issues
- Recycling and re-using materials wherever possible

- Using video-conferencing wherever possible to reduce travel
- Using only diesel vehicles
